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## 1 The ultimate relax

Speak to the team at **Peppers Parihua** and order a fresh hamper of local artisan goodies for a picnic under a lush country tree, at a vineyard or in a park. When you return to your room, enjoy a bottle of pinot delivered to your door with local cheeses and snuggle up by the fireplace.



## 2 Cycle the vines

Travelling between the vineyards is easy in the Wairarapa. Just hire a bike and cycle within a 2-3 kilometre radius along flat country lanes to all the local wineries.



## 3 Stonehenge experience

A full scale adaptation of Stonehenge has been built in Aotearoa so you can venture into the past and experience the stone circles for yourselves.



## 4 A bird's eye view

View the world from a different angle and head up to Carterton (a 25 minute drive from Peppers Parihua) to glide over the stunning landscape of the Wairarapa in a hot air balloon.



## 5 Bush to beach drive

If you're feeling adventurous head out to see the lighthouse at Cape Palliser for some panoramic ocean views. Follow up with some of the world's best fish and chips and a beer at the Lake Ferry Hotel situated on the shores of Lake Onoke.
