## WHAT ARE THE RECREATION TRAILS?

The recreation trails are a network of paths that link 'green space' throughout urban Masterton. Highly popular with walkers, cyclists, runners and dog owners, the trails welcome people of all ages to explore Masterton's one-of-many gems.

## ABOUT THE TRAILS:

- Use: Walking and Mountainbiking
- Trails: 3 – all interconnected, but can be ridden separately
- Rules: Shared paths, please be courteous to other users
- Longest Trail: 5km (trail network 15km in total)
- Highest point: 100m
- Dogs allowed: Yes
- E-Bike friendly: Yes

The trails are predominantly lime with some connections being achieved through the use of existing pedestrian footpaths, and are dotted with picnic tables and benches for you to stop and relax.

There's plenty of information signs to assist you with directions, distances and general trail information, so get exploring today!

Note – please close gates where indicated as stock may be grazing. Dogs must be on leash at Henley Lake Wetlands between 1st August and 30th December.

- Queen Elizabeth Park
- Tararua Forest Park
- Millennium Reserve
- Solway Bush – Native remnant forest

# WHERE ARE THE TRAILS AND HOW CAN I GET TO THEM?

The trail network covers approx. 15km of interconnected trails, with various entrances to the different trails.

## Henley Lake and Wetlands Trail (3.6km)

Enter from Colombo Road or Te Ore Ore Road; parking available at both entrances.

## Landsdowne Trail (5.1km)

Enter at Fourth Street, off State Highway 2 on the north side of Masterton or the Manuka Reserve, or Milford Downs

## Waipoua River Trail (2.5km)

Enter from Colombo Road car park, or commence at the start on Akura Road, near the railway station.
